



Scout Programs at the Loudoun Museum

The Loudoun Museum is pleased to offer several new Brownie and Girl Scout badge programs. Our programs are held in the restored Stephen Donaldson cabin, built in 1768. Many of our programs include guided walking tours in historic Leesburg to meet badge requirements. One of the *new* **Brownie Try-Its** we will be offering is “Her Story”. Brownie Scouts will have a chance to get an in-depth look at historically important women in Loudoun County, using primary sources and period clothing. It’s a fun and exciting way to learn the history of your community and earn a badge. For the **Junior Scouts**, in addition to our four current programs, we will also offer “Humans and Habitats”. Scouts will learn about the Native American cultures in Loudoun County by looking at artifacts, learning games and completing a craft project. Our **Cadet Interest Project** programs will cover 3-4 categories for each badge. A great way to begin or complete your badge! In our “Museum Discovery” program, Scouts will get a behind the scenes tour of our Museum, something not offered to the public. They will learn about the inner workings of a small museum and have a chance to design their own exhibit.
